# The Pyles are both unlucky, very lucky

Question: What does it take to win in the TFL? Skill? Yes. Luck? Oh sure. A timely trip to Central America? Absolutely.

But how many *points* does it take? We were recently asked this very question, so we set out to answer it the way we always do — by thumbing through stacks of musty newsletters, performing long division in the margins of USA Today, and consulting massive books on statistical formulae.

(Actually, we just ran a few queries on the TFL's massive supercomputer. But never mind about that.)

First, to divine the magical number, we decided to calculate the median winning score — that is, we scanned a list of 1,852 game scores dating back to 1992,

ordered them from lowest to highest, and sped for the middle of the list. What we found will vindicate Ken Sain, the crotchety Dugway owner who is convinced that 38 points should be a winning score on any given week.

Actually, the magic number is 35. So, historically speaking, if you score 36 points, you stand a better than 50 percent chance of winning.

But how many points does it take to have a *really* good chance — not just a 50-50 shot — of winning? For this task, we calculated the median score for the 908 winning scores in TFL history. This time the magic number is 44. That means that 44 points will give you a 50-50 shot of outscoring any given week's slate of *winning* teams — and therefore an excellent shot at beating one of the

13 teams you might draw on any particular Sunday.

Of course, a few lucky folks have defied all the reams of statistical data.

also the luckiest team in league history. It's true.

Showing utter disregard for our magical medians, the Pyles have won 16 games in which they scored fewer than 30

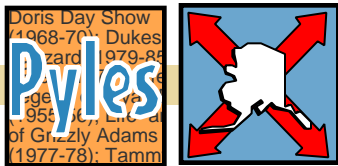
points. The next luckiest team, Baltimore, has only 11 such victories.

But are the Pyles *really* lucky? Yep. The Pyles also have won four games in which they scored fewer than 20 points. Pyles owner Mike Taylor likes to attribute these victories to 'D-ing Up'; we call it kissing cosmic ass.

Of course, the luckiest run in TFL history is known by many without running a single database query: the 1997 East Hartford Ex-Eskimos. The Ex-'Mos strung together a remarkable five-game winning streak in which they never scored more than 31 points in any game.

It was against that backdrop that the infamous Luck vs. Skill debates began in TrashTalk.

Four years later, the debate still rages.

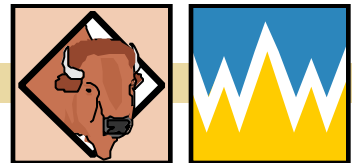


## Narcoossee at Alaska

# Expansion committee may decide to contract instead

The Times Football League's second expansion is on hold, and possibly in danger, as the league's expansion committee pores over its options in the wake of the last month's spirited debate at the TFL Convention in New York.

The decision to expand, approved 10-4 by owners before this year's draft, has been complicated by an increasingly passionate debate over the future of the league as well as rumblings from East Hartford owner Chris Reidy, who indicated he might retire at season's end.

"The debate has gone from rubber stamp to deep soul-searching," said Bagdad's Scott Lacy, who is chairing the TFL's expansion committee. "It's no longer just an issue of which two teams to nominate. A great many options are being explored at this time, including, if you can believe this, contraction."

TFL sources indicate there are three scenarios being explored by the expansion committee:

1. Expanding the league to 16 and adding two franchises to the league.
2. Remaining at 14 teams if Reidy retires, opening up one slot for an expansion team.
3. Seeking the voluntary retirement of two teams and remaining at 14 teams, opening up two slots for expansion teams.

That wide range of options seemed unthinkable just one month ago after a summer during which the looming expansion vote was viewed with near indifference. But an emotional debate after last month's draft unearthed strong and previously unaired opinions about the league's future.

The debate also exposed a sharp

philosophical division within the league, with one side advocating the forced retirement of certain "stealth" owners and the other side declaring that the core membership is sacrosanct and therefore should be considered owners for life.

Denver's Mike Taylor, a vocal advocate of much-maligned Willow owner Van Williams, was adamant that owners such as Williams are owners for as long as they care to be, regardless of their participation.

"Young Van is part of the Times family," Taylor said, "and always should be."

But other owners indicated that William's low profile, along with his seeming indifference to owning a TFL franchise, made him a logical candidate for replacement.

In particular, Williams was criticized for his near no-show at last year's TFL convention, despite the fact it was held in Williams' hometown.

Last month's post-draft debate raged for so long and at such a volume that hotel security was summoned at one point. Once things calmed down a bit, a theme slowly began to emerge among even the most polarized owners: the TFL experience, for better or worse, is about shared history and continuing kinship.

"It became pretty clear that no one particularly cared how competitive the league is," Lacy said, recalling the night's debate. "Make no mistake, everyone wants to win the loot. But I think we all agree the sustaining force behind the TFL is friendship, and that friendship is why we play this game in the first place."

Notably absent from the evening's debate was Dugway's Ken Sain, a longstanding critic of owners such as Williams, who left the draft in the 11th round to go clubbing with

friends. Sain has repeatedly said that certain owners would be better off competing in an ESPN league given their lack of visible participation.

"I can understand some owners not having the money to travel to the conventions," Sain said. "But, I was very disappointed Van only made it to the draft when we were in Anchorage. I realize he has rivalries with Nate and Casey, but as far as I can tell, he couldn't even tell you which states the league's other 11 owners live in."

In addition to Williams' Willow franchise, the other franchise targeted was Mike and Bob Continelli's Lancers. None of the owners doubted Lackawanna's competitiveness, but many pointed out that skill alone does not constitute a good TFL franchise. After five years in the league, the Continellis have not shown an interest in becoming part of the TFL community — unlike another non-Timesian, Don Carlock, who has attended six of the league's seven conventions.

"I think every TFL owner should think about why they want to be in this league," Lacy said. "If the friendship and unique experience of this league is not important to you, then I'd say there are more than a few people in the league who would want you to step aside for someone else."

Lacy said the expansion committee hoped to deliver timelines for its recommendations in the next two weeks. Until then, Lacy adds, the league's owners need to continue the debate in TrashTalk while the decision-making process is still underway.

Once the expansion committee makes its recommendations, the league will vote as a whole to determine the final outcome. Lacy said he expects the league vote could occur as early as mid-December.
