## Willow trashes Arctic to seize the TFL's best record

WILLOW, Alaska - The hype has already begun.

Well before the Weasels' 35-16 victory over the Arctic Gators to claim top billing in the Times Football League, the play-off-starved Willow fans sensed something special prior to the 1999 season.

Team owner Van Williams vowed before to the draft to get his team back into the playoffs, which hasn't happened since Willow's improbable Sweeney Bowl title drive in 1993, and backed it up by drafting arguably the league's deep-

est team. And the players are coming through in a big way.

Led by unlikely studs, the Weasels have streaked to a franchise-best 5-1 start for the best record in the TFL, considered around the world as the premier fantasy football league. In addition, Willow Has already matched last season's win total (5-8-1) in just six weeks.

Clutch performances from Troy Aikman, normally a fantasy bust, and Isaac Bruce, normally an injured-riddled transaction waiting to happen, have highlighted the abrupt turnaround. Aikman's team-record 38-point effort on

opening day all but clinched victory for the Weasels while Bruce answered with his own 30-point plus day to spearhead a week-five victory.

Now this small-market franchise from small-town Alaska is looking down on the rest of the league. Not bad for a community known better for producing world-class dog mushers and rednecks than a football power. And the residents have taken notice.

Willow tickets are the hottest item in town, regularly forcing die-hard fans to camp out all night and wait in line for hours. Call-in radio sports shows are dominated by Weasel smack-talkers, often directing their attention on the Willow naysayers. And team merchandise sales have skyrocketed, thanks to the hot-selling "Combover Crazy's" T-shirts at a 2-for-1 bargain.

"The response has been unbelievable," said Williams, long the laughingstock of the TFL with three losing seasons in six years. "Even our preseason games sold out. Hell, we were outdrawing Capitol Speedway, and you know how rednecks love stock car racing."

There is no question the Weasels are for real. But the rest of the TFL is just now finding out. Willow is a legitimate Sweeney Bowl contender, perhaps even the favorite, after beating league strong-arms Bagdad, the league's all-time win leader, and East Hartford, last season's regular-season and

Sweeney Bowl champion.

A deep and talented roster is a major reason for Willow's success as a new hero seems to emerge each week. If it's not Aikman or Bruce, then it's Randy Moss, Al Del Greco or Antowain Smith. That's what makes Willow so dangerous, opponents never know which guy will throw up a 30-something day to beat you.

And in typical Willow fashion, the Weasels are doing their talking on the field rather than through the media. Team management

limits player interviews and Williams can rarely be reached, something the team has regularly taken a hit on from other owners.

Williams plans on making up for his missing presence by throwing an owners party for the 2000 TFL convention held in Anchorage, where he will make his first appearance in the ever-popular flag football game.

"That's where real owners do their talking," Williams said. "On the field."

# Ex'mos just threw in that last TD for balance

HEBRON - The Monday night game was winding down, and though his East Hartford Ex-Eskimos had long ago clinched a victory - in fact, the Exmos' first two players, Drew Bledsoe and Tyrone Wheatley, had provided sufficient points Sunday afternoon - Chris Reidy was anxiously watching the Dallas Cowboys trying to punch in a tying touchdown.

"That's it, E-Man!" Reidy shouted as Emmitt Smith scored, giving the Exmos a 46-16 victory over the Narcoossee Nose Apes.

Was it another case of the Exmos running it up - a charge Reidy half-heartedly denied last year after an 82-20 nuking of the Dugway Experiments?

"Oh, no, not at all," Reidy said at his weekly press conference. "No, nothing like that. The Dugway game, well, let's just say that was our jihad. This was different."

Reidy insisted it was nothing personal against Nose Apes owner Wit Tuttell - in fact, the two have had a good relationship dating to their days as graduate assistants on Steve Spurrier's staff at Florida. He said it was, rather, a case of meeting a long-sought goal.

"See, that TD gave me at least one from every player," Reidy said. "And in a huge, huge game, one that I think put us right back in the thick of things. That's the kind of balance that last year's team was lacking."

Oh yes, "balance." The word Reidy would spit out every week last season, after

Steve Young would score 50 or 60 percent of the team's points in another victory. Reidy is hoping this year's team - while lacking the flash of last year's - will prove more solid throughout the season with production from more than one key

player.

So far, you can't argue with the results. The Exmos' victory left them at 4-2, tying them with the Nose Apes and three other teams for the TFL's second-best record. They're all one game behind the surprising 5-1 Willow Weasels, led by the enigmatic Van Williams, whose existence can neither be confirmed nor denied.

Reidy's mantra during the off-season was not to expect much from this team. On the heels of the best season in TFL history, one that had East Hartford tag-

ging itself "The TFL's Most Successful Franchise," Reidy figured the team was due for a let-down. After opening 2-0, the Exmos then staggered to consecutive losses and followed it up by trading backup QB Kurt Warner to Dutch Harbor for Adrian Murrell - laying claim to "The TFL's Least Successful Player Transaction."

But the Exmos have now won back-to-back games and find themselves in a three-way tie atop the league's toughest division, the Kotter. They are also ranked No.4 in the TFL Power Poll, though that doesn't carry much weight with their owner.

"Oh, you mean the 'Poer Poll,'" Reidy said. "You know, the one that doesn't account for W's."

Of course, the clutch victory - "One of our finest performances ever, really," Reidy said - brought about the usual caterwauling about the luck factor.

"Pfffffffbbbbtttt," Reidy said, sighing with such force

it flipped the tuft of dark blond hair atop his forehead. "Oh yeah, that's me, Joe Fucking Lucky. Yeah, Rob Moore, who I had hoped would be my top receiver, has run most of his routes in the trainer's room. And now, he has Dave BROWN throwing him the ball. And I really lucked out when the Ravens started dressing Jermaine Lewis in the opponent's jersey, resulting in about two passes being thrown to him all season.

Reidy was quick to credit Mike Taylor for a similar job. The Exmos face the Perennially Great Pyles this week in another big game for

both teams.

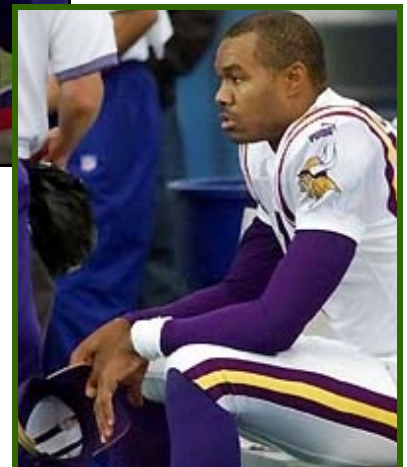
"You also look at the job Dr. T has done in Denver," Reidy said. "A lot of owners would have packed it in after losing a player like Terrell Davis. Instead, Mike's battled his way to 3-3, and I know he's looking at this game the same way we were looking at Narcoosee last week: A chance to pull even with a playoff contender. I think - no, I know - we're in for another battle this week."

# Kitchen turns up the burners on Baltimore

BALTIMORE - Did he get what he deserved? Did he get what was coming to him? Or was it just a short detour on the road to the playoffs?

Anchorage's mashing of an uncharacteristically low-scoring Baltimore team was as much a shock to those in the Barons' organization as it was to those in the winning lockerroom.

The Kitchen's Nate Sagan sent Steve Katz what could be called a reverse bulletin-board quote earlier in the week, saying, "I've got absolutely no shot against you. Our teams are headed in vastly different directions. I'm absolutely doomed."

"Narcoossee's quarterback hasn't had his annual injury yet, and you don't count Brett Favre's thumb-arm-



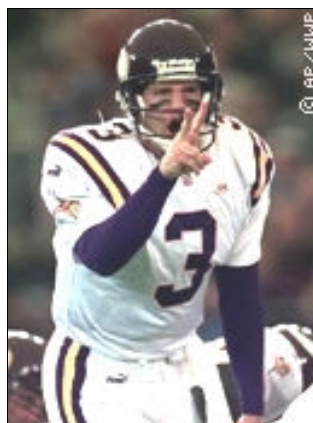

"Willow owns the best record in the league, but what Williams thought was one of the best quarterback situations in the league is now a bit weakened, with Aikman's receivers going down like so many Monica Lewinsky imper-

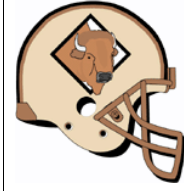
In this league you can lose when your opponent's QB scores 0, and win when he throws for 5 touchdowns. Meaning neither team is safe.

**Line: Baltimore – any mercy**

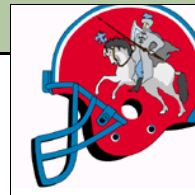
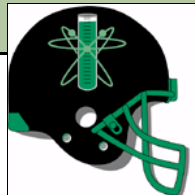
We hereby make an exception to the rule about picking Bagdad until they win one.
