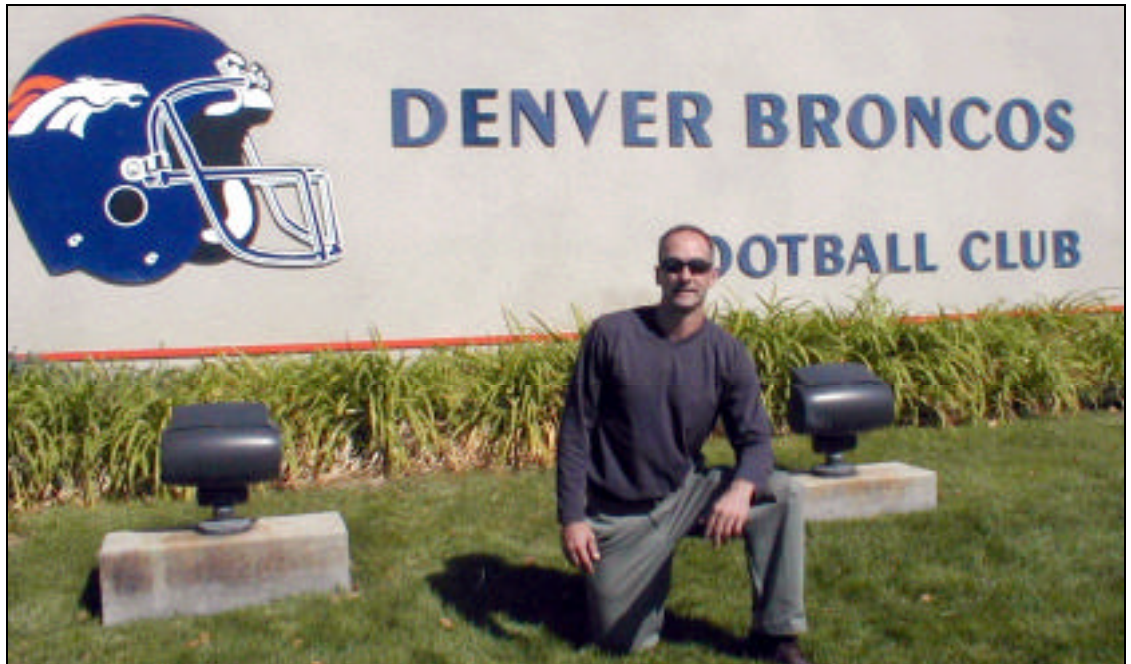

ATWO Again

Pyles' Taylor poised to reclaim title from Lacy

It has been 1,873 days since Scott Lacy dethroned Mike Taylor at the all-time winningest owner in TFL history.

Now it's Lacy's turn to count the days.

Scratch that. Lacy should be counting the hours, because considering how bad the 2001 Newts are, he doesn't have much time left as ATWO.

The Denver Pyles took their turn on the punching bag for-

merly known as the Baltimore Barons this weekend for their 88th regular-season victory. That brings Denver into a tie with Bagdad.

The Newts, because of an extra tie game, have a slightly better winning percentage, giving them the ATWO crown. For now.

"As of this moment, I consider myself the real ATWO title holder because of the T-Rex that sits on my fireplace mantle, figuratively at least," Taylor said. "As soon as I get a fireplace mantle I'm looking into getting a T-Rex repli-

Inside the numbers

Smith and Owens causing headaches

Wide receivers are an unpredictable lot. They tend to be streaky scorers whose production hinges on their quarterback, their offensive line, even their offensive coordinator.

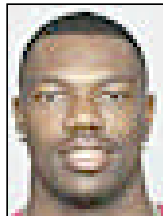
Needless to say, picking the top receiver in any given season is a difficult proposition. Which means the odds of one team picking the top two receivers in a season must be downright prohibitive, right?



Rod Smith

Wrong.

The 2001 Lancers, 7-1 and tied for the Kotter Division lead with Flint, take the field each week with what increasingly appears to be the greatest receiving duo in TFL history: Rod Smith and Terrell Owens. Just past the midpoint of the season, Smith and Owens have combined for 170 points and are threatening to rewrite the record books.

Smith, in particular, is in the midst of a historic season. He has 93 points so far and is comfortably on pace to break Herman Moore's 1995 season record for most points by a wide receiver.

Barring a late collapse, the Lancers will obliterate Denver's TFL record for most points by wide receivers in a season. The 1998 Pyles, featuring a receiving corps of Randy Moss, Cris Carter, and Marvin Harrison, posted 213 points from the receiver slot.

Lackawanna's receivers are on a pace to score 299 points by season's end. Even more remarkably, in just eight games this season, Lancer receivers have already outscored all but 14 of the most productive

receiving corps in the history of the league.

It's a stunning achievement for the Brothers Continelli, who somehow managed to tap the league's top two receivers without expending a No. 1 pick for either one.

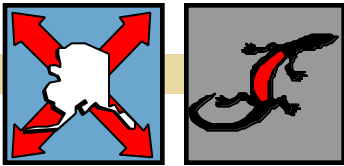
The Lancer wideouts have been numbingly consistent. They've scored 10 points or more in six of Lackawanna's eight games this season. And their top weekly production this season, 38 points, doesn't even rank among the top 10 weekly performances in league history.

Who holds the one-week scoring record for receivers? The Narcoossee Nose Apes, whose combo of Irving Fryar and Jerry Rice combined for a whopping 57 points in the 1994 season opener. In a twist, the rest of Narcoossee's five players combined for just nine points that weekend.

But what about the only other positional tandem, the backfield? Here, the Lancers are average at best, amassing just 69 points from a backfield led by Jerome Bettis and Tyrone Wheatley.

The record by a TFL backfield is held by the 1998 Alaska Oosiks, who popped for 294 points behind Terrell Davis and Garrison Hearst. The top one-week scoring record for a backfield? The 1999 Alaska Oosiks, whose backfield of Marshall Faulk and Corey Dillon combined for 42 points in that year's season finale.

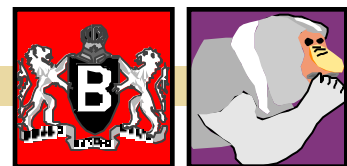

No matter. Lacy has his hands full just trying to keep this year's Bagdad team from shattering the record for fewest points scored in a season. He doesn't have time to be worrying about trying to hold on to the All-Time Winningest Owner crown.

But, Lacy is undaunted. He's ever guaranteed his Newts will make the Sweeney Bowl Tournament this year.

"This year?" a shocked reporter asked.

"The Newts will make the playoffs. What, did I stutter?" Lacy said.

I guess that is why they call it fantasy football.

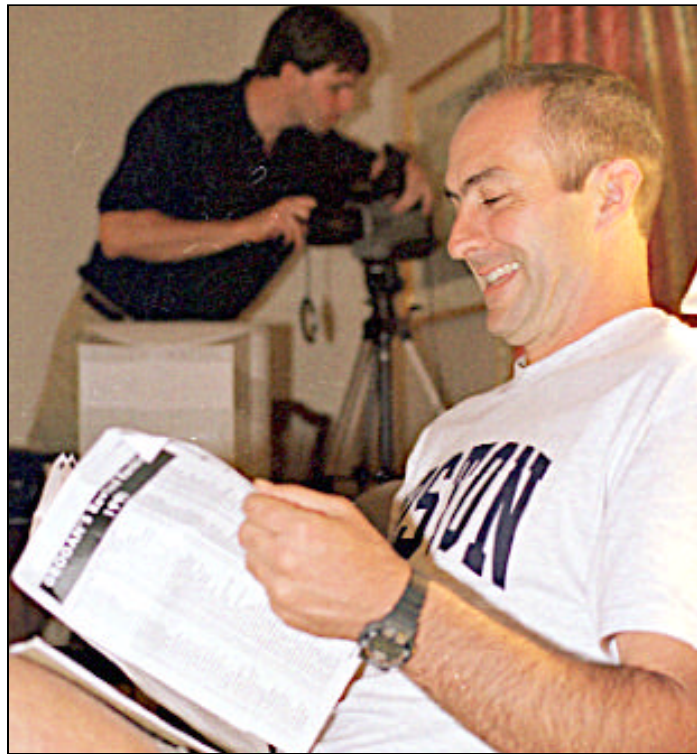
Taylor was the original ATWO, having claimed that title at the end of 1991 with a then-record 11-3 season.

He held the crown unchallenged until 1995, when he briefly allowed Wit Tuttell's Narcoossee Nose Apes to move ahead. By Week 7, Taylor had reclaimed his title. But, Lacy rallied at the end of that season, finishing tied with Taylor for most victories.

Then came 1996. Taylor's Pyles opened with five straight losses while the Newts won their first four games and seven of their first nine. That made Scott Lacy the ATWO on Sept. 1, 1996.

"I never thought it would take this long to reclaim the title," Taylor said. "The Newts have actually been a pretty good regular-season outfit, and that has surprised me.

"Oddly, Lacy's best years have come when he's had a girlfriend. I think they distracted him just enough to keep him from thinking out his draft picks and doing real harm to his franchise. The Newts we're seeing this year are a case of full-on fantasy football malpractice."

Lacy is equally as impressed with Taylor's teams.

"The Pyles deserve each and every one of their losses — and there have been many, many of those," Lacy said. "They've also earned their legion of harsh truth-telling critics. As for the occasional wins, the rare postseason appearance, the cosmos-defying Sweeney Bowl title — they are all richly and completely undeserved. Pyles blow."

Taylor counters that if it wasn't for some fuzzy math on the part of Lacy, he would have been the undisputed ATWO ages ago.

"Well, you may remember that we used to count playoff games on the all-time victory list," Taylor said. "But Lacy's amazing streak of playoff ineptitude continued to grow — swift and downward, like the root of Jack's beanstalk burrowing to China — and it became apparent that counting playoff games on the ATWO list posed a serious threat to Lacy's reputation as a

competent TFL owner, let alone a great one. The Newts' crisis — 11 straight playoff losses — reached its apex about the same year the Pyles breezed through the playoffs and won the T-Rex. Ever since, only regular-season games have counted on the ATWO list. I felt bad, but then Wilt Chamberlain sent me a nice card pointing out that they'd done something similar to him back in his day, widened the foul lane or something, to curb his dominance.

"And yet, the Pyles never strayed from ATWO striking distance. A couple years ago, the Pyles were about to reclaim the ATWO crown when Lancaster inexplicably came to the Newts' rescue. Supposedly he uncovered two or three victories for which the Newts were never credited — one against Desiree Humphries, another against Bob "Netherworld" Netherthon, probably — and that staved off the surging Pyles for the time being. I don't know

what would compel a non-owner to sit there and count year-by-year records of a TFL team.

"Whatever the case, it only delayed the inevitable, which will take place this Sunday when Pyles reclaim their ATWO crown."

And once Taylor has the crown again?

"I plan to hold the title for good," Taylor said. "It means more to me than it did before, now that I understand how difficult it can be to reclaim even from an owner as inept as Lacy.

"Lacy has angered the TFL gods by studying fantasy mags too much. Now the gods are unleashing their wrath, showing him that fantasy football is not a hard science, but a delicate mixture of intuition, beer, faith and a little knowledge. You've got to go with your gut, work with the flow seas, the tides, and the bio-rhythms of the players, to craft a really outstanding squad, one that can manage a few steps in the playoffs without toppling over."
