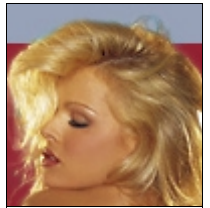

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## East Hartford victory crashes ATWO party

Emmitt Smith's 18-second  
symphony overcomes  
Dugway in pyrrhic victory

HEBRON - The last time the East Hartford Ex-Eskimos celebrated a victory this large, owner Chris Reidy could be found blinking the champagne from his eyes.

This time, it was tears. "Ooooooh boy," were Reidy's words to open his Tuesday press conference, as he took a moment to gather himself. "What, really, can you say about that performance? I don't think there's been a more heroic effort in TFL history - or maybe a bigger win in Ex-Eskimos history. And believe me, I don't make either of those comparisons lightly."

Indeed. The Exmos have had their share of big performances in recent years, most notably a Sweeney Bowl victory over the Alaska Oosiks last year that came down to the Sunday night game. But this ... well, as Reidy said, words are hard to find.

As if Emmitt Smith hadn't already cemented his place in Exmos lore, leading the expansion team to the Sweeney Bowl in its first year, he turned in the Monday Night Miracle of the Century. With

the Exmos trailing by 16 at Dugway, Smith scored two touchdowns, including a 63-yarder, and rushed for 140 yards in a 19-point performance that gave East Hartford a 48-45 victory.

Making Smith's performance more poignant was the broken bone in his hand he sustained on the first

score. Yet he valiantly stuck it out for the rest of the half, leaving owners around the TFL awe-struck.

"This should put Emmitt in the TFL Hall of Fame," said Bagdad Newts owner Scott Lacy, who might be considered the Father of the TFL once the DNA tests come back.

To fully appreciate Smith's performance, one has to first understand the circumstances: The Exmos were 5-3, in a three-way tie for first place in the Kotter Division, widely acknowledged as the league's toughest. Every game was crucial.

\* The Exmos were facing their archest archrival, the Dugway Experiments, who were no doubt looking for blood after an 82-20 ass-jacking in East Hartford last year. As if to up the already considerable ante, Tubes owner Ken Sain threw in his weekly barb about Reidy's reliance on luck, wondering aloud "when Reidy is going to get some payback."

"I guess Ken's check must have bounced," Reidy said Tuesday.

\* The Exmos were without Drew Bledsoe, the TFL's No. 3 scorer, and running back Tyrone Wheatley, both on byes. Their "replacements," Tim Couch and the much- (and justifiably) maligned Adrian Murrell, combined to score as many points as Dugway has TFL titles.

\* Oh, and did we mention Sain and Reidy entered the game tied for the fifth spot on the ATWO list?

"Not anymore," said Reidy, who now stands alone in fifth despite playing one fewer year than Sain - and two fewer than the top four. "I know it might only last a week, but I would love to take a picture of those standings, frame it and hang it up in my office."

Sain pulled out all the stops on Sunday, even resorting to the heavily scoffed-at WIM maneuver when he claimed



Denver's "one if" Olandis "and two if by sea" Gary helped the Pyles to a win that vaulted them into first place in the Barbarino Division. True to his belief in not getting excited over winning a regular-season game, Mike Taylor left it to us to mention it.

"Reidy is kicking my ass" after the Exmos took a 22-2 lead. But at that point, Couch and Murrell had already pitched shutouts, and Tubes QB Jon Kitna, RB Mike Alstott and high-scoring kicker Todd Peterson had yet to take the field.

When the dust had settled, the Experiments had a 45-29 lead with only Emmitt left to rescue East Hartford.

"You know, I don't want to overlook Muhsin Muhammad's performance here," Reidy said. "His 17 points were crucial. They gave the team a glimmer of hope."

Oddly enough, Muhammad and Derrick Mayes would combine for 24 points, more than half the Exmos' total. The first three weeks of the season, Exmos receivers combined for one point - total.

But in the end, it was the beloved E-Man who would be ultimately responsible for the victory.

"You know why Emmitt has two M's in his name?" Reidy said. "For Monday Miracle."

Once the euphoria subsided, however, Reidy soberly faced the prospect of playing the next two to five weeks without the greatest player in franchise history.

"I can only hope that Emmitt's proud performance has given the team enough of a boost to last a few weeks," Reidy said. "We're 6-3, and normally you'd think just two more victories would get us in the playoffs. But I'm not so sure this year. The way teams like Narcoossee, Willow and Lackawanna are playing, 8-6 might not be good enough to get in this year. And that's not even mentioning the pack of 5-4 teams out there like Denver and Baltimore - franchises that know something about winning a Sweeney Bowl."

"No, it's going to be one tough, Emmittless road."

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# Barons have the answer for Lancer challenge

It is one of those silent wars you do not, with all due respect to Yogi Berra, observe by watching. You have to look at those red numbers in the standings to pick it up. It is the bone of contention that makes Lackawanna's trip to Baltimore this Sunday the TFL's game of the week. 398 to 398.

The Lancers and Barons are tied for the TFL scoring lead.

Baltimore has led the league in scoring since opening day, paced by Peyton Manning, the man who has been the league's individual scoring leader for almost that long.

Lackawanna, which has been lampooned in league circles

for keeping Joey Galloway on its roster, and even starting him one day, has been close behind, and caught the Barons on Monday night when Leroy Hoard rushed for 87 yards and earned the Lancers measly two points.

They beat Flint, 35-30, while Baltimore was eking out an uncharacteristically flimsy 30-26 victory over Alaska, and caught the Barons in the "PF" column.

Lackawanna is one of the teams to beat in the second half. We actually barely survived or didn't survive what on paper was the easiest stretch on our schedule," said Katz, mindful that paper is where it matters in this case. "Now we play nothing but tall timber for the rest of the year.

"We need to play like I know we can, and not let up, for every game from now on."

The Barons, with all that talent and all those points, have never even been more than a game over .500 all year. The story is different in Lackawanna.

The Lancers are 6-3 and may be the better team. The matchups are wafer thin.

**Edgerrin James-James Stewart.** Rookie of The Year candidate vs. a player who remains a viable fantasy scorer, with a healthy Fred Taylor having coming out of one game already and letting Stewart score twice. Edge to James.

**Ken Oxendine-Greg Hill.** Oxendine shares the ball; Hill totes it full-time and already has a 100-yard game. Edge to him.

## Other remembrances of Walter 'Sweetness' Payton

My first memory of Walter Payton ranks among my first memories of the NFL. It was 1977, and I'd been following football seriously for only a year at that point.

I don't remember what CBS game I was watching that Nov. 20 day, but I do remember the constant cutaways for highlights of Payton piling up yards in snow so deep you couldn't see the sidelines.

At the end, he had a record 275 yards - a record, as they say, that still stands. There are entire Super Bowls I've watched and forgotten since that day, but those highlights are forever etched in my memory.

Highlights were about all you got to see of Payton in those days, when a 7-7 record was considered a good year for the former Monsters of the Midway.

Then came Mike Ditka and nearly immediate respect for the Bears, who began a steady climb to Super Bowl contenders. Finally, it seemed Payton's years of toiling in anonymity were about to be rewarded.

They were - but in my mind, the reward money came up a little short. Yes, the Bears would rout the Patriots 46-10 in Super Bowl XX. But in typical '80s fashion, the style of that team - epitomized by the bandanna-wearing, Super Bowl-shuffling gunslinger, Jim McMahon - outshone the substance of a Payton or a Mike Singletary.

In my mind, one moment would have made Payton's career complete: a richly deserved Super Bowl touchdown. Yet that honor was reserved instead for William "The Refrigerator" Perry, a 300-pound freak show whose career lasted about as long as a gallon of milk removed from his namesake.

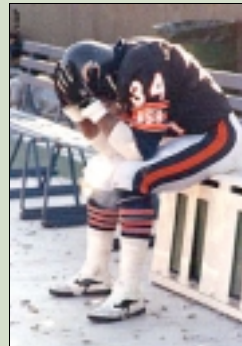
