Bay Area stars unhappy with their TFL owners

The Bay Area is experiencing a tectonic shift of a different sort: Key TFL players from the San Francisco-Oakland area are grouching about their teams' performance and their role in the organizations.

Even the league's most prolific scorer, Rich Gannon of the Hartford Ex-Eskimos, seems ill at ease.

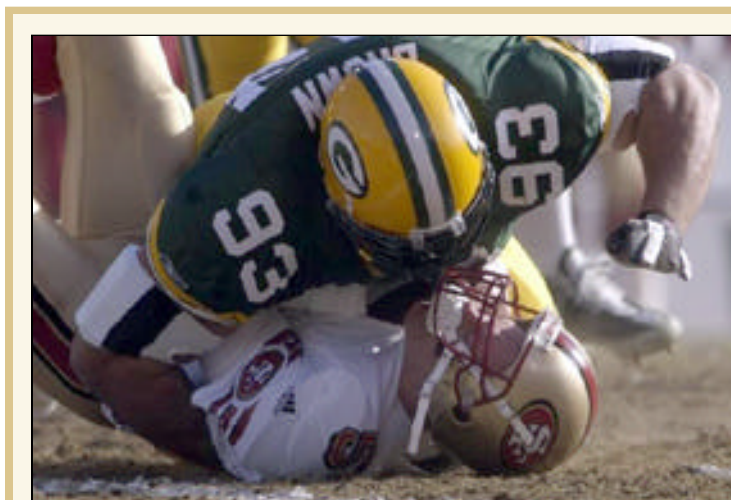
"It's ridiculous," said Gannon, who has scored a league-high 169 points. "In my day job, with the Raiders, I throw the ball to Jerry Rice and Tim Brown, two of the best receivers to ever lace up cleats. (Ex-Eskimos coach Chris) Reidy can't do any better than give me Marty Booker and Curtis Conway. Hell, if I had a receiver with a pulse, imagine how many points I could put up for this team."

When it was pointed out to Gannon that, technically, he's not really throwing the ball to Booker and Conway, seeing as how the TFL is a "fantasy" league, the quarterback snapped. "That's crap. When I visit the TFL Web site and go to the Hartford team page, Marty and Curtis are listed as my teammates. I'm telling you, I'm not getting enough help from the organization. No way should we be just 5-6."

The mood of Gannon's quarterbacking counterpart, Willow's Jeff Garcia, is just as temperamental.

Fresh off the 49ers' heart-breaking overtime loss in San Diego, Garcia expressed displeasure at being questioned on TFL matters.

"You know what? I haven't

even thought about it. Furthermore, I'm not GOING to think about it," Garcia said when asked if he was disappointed with Willow being in third place in the Spenard Division. "I just played my guts out against the Chargers, and you want to ask me about a league in which I'm not even paid for my efforts? Screw that, man."

Before leaving, however, Garcia took a small jab at Willow owner Van Williams: "Van's a great guy, OK? But I

and a lot of other players on this team wonder how committed he is to winning. I've scored 109 points for the guy. Seems like he could do more with that than he's done."

When the Lackawanna Lancers took Terrell Owens with the No. 5 pick in the fall draft, it was with the clear hope that the mercurial but talented wide receiver would lead the team to great heights. However, a team official, speaking on the condi-

Sain admits media guide is history

There will be no media guide for the 2002 TFL season, ending a tradition that started in 1993.

"I just don't think there's any interest in it anymore," TFL Commissioner Ken Sain said. "When I told Steve Katz I wasn't going to do it, he said, 'Oh, I didn't even notice we didn't have one.'"

Scott Lacy began putting together a preseason media guide before the 1993 season. During the nine-year run of media guides the publication has grown in size. The 2001 guide, which appears to be the last, was 56 pages.

That, and the strike that kept editorial content out of the last issue of TFL Today, have threatened the future of TFL Publications.

"Video killed the radio star," Lacy said. "I think T-Talk, as wonderful as it is, has single-handedly pushed the newsletter to the brink of obsolescence. Which is really sad. Back in '94 and '95, the newsletter was the TFL. If you didn't read TFL Today back then, you knew nothing about the league. The scores, the trannies, the owners' comments — all of those things were the exclusive domain of TFL Today.

"Hate to say it, but TFL Today is dying a slow death. It's sad, but inevitable."

Sain suspects this might be the last year of the newsletter.

"It's suffering from a creative lapse. I can only tell people how great the Tubes are in so many ways. Lacy can only find so many excuses for why his team under-performs every week. Hell, no one even noticed that there was no content in last week. I wonder if any of them even read it."

Lacy added: "It would be great if someone new took TFL Today and ran with it, but I'm not optimistic about that happening. Fact is, we're all older and busier. For most of us, cranking out fictional stories about fictional teams just isn't a top priority. And I don't see that changing any time soon."

► **DIVISION SHOWDOWNS:** The highlight of the expansion package was a promise that divisional rivals would get to play each other twice a season. This week begins the second series of head-to-head matchups within the four TFL divisions.

Notebook

These three weeks will decide the Spenard Division, where all four teams are within one game of the other. Anyone who wins all three will probably win the division.

Lackawanna has made a strong second-half run and can still win the Gambell Division, but the Lancers need help. They play division-leading Arctic on the final weekend of regular-season play. They must win that game. Plus, they need the Gators to lose one more than they do in the other two games.

Winning the division may be the Lancers only hope of making the playoffs. Both Dutch Harbor and Tampa Bay, the co-leaders in the Spenard, own a tie-breaking edge over Lackawanna for the wildcard berth.

In the Sourdough Conference, three teams are still in contention for the Muldoon title. The winner of this weekend's East Hartford-Baltimore game will be the favorite. Throw in Limerick and all three will also battle for the wildcard with Bagdad. All three Muldoon teams own a tie-breaker edge over the Newts if they finish with identical records.

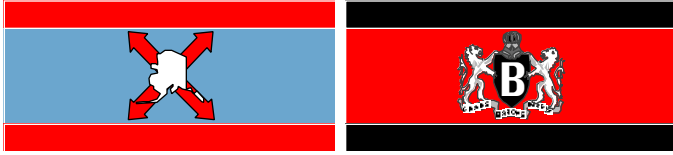
Dugway only needs a win or a Bagdad loss to clinch the Fireweed title. The Experiments can clinch the top seed with a win, or losses by Bagdad and Baltimore.

► **FAST STARTS:** Dugway and Arctic are still battling for the regular-season title and 5 percent of the pot. Both are 9-2.

This is the first time two teams have started the season that well. In 1998, East Hartford was 10-1 and Alaska 8-2-1 after nine weeks for the previous best start by two teams in a season.

Still, Dugway and Arctic trail Dutch Harbor in the race for the points-scoring title and another 5 percent of the pot. Casey Brogan's Dawgs lead the league with 558 points. The Gators are 45 points behind and the Tubes 55. Both must make up the difference in three weeks if they hope to be the second team to ever win the elusive Triple Crown.

Prediction: Newts 53, Oosiks 51.

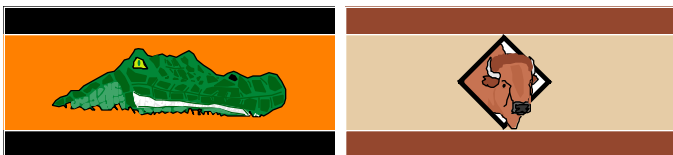


Tampa Bay at Willow

Prediction: Gators 37, Bison 34.

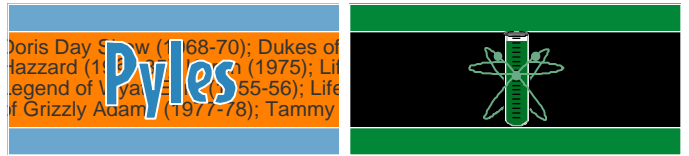


Limerick at Narcoossee

Prediction: Pyles 44, Experiments 33.

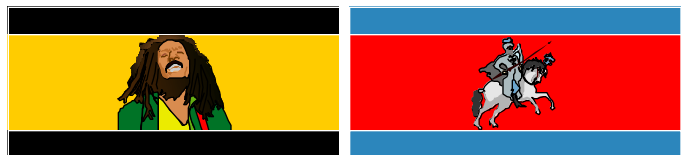


Dutch Harbor at Anchorage

Clearing up the playoff picture

Dugway

The Experiments have all but locked up a berth. They need a win, or a Bagdad loss in the final three games to clinch the division. A win also gives them the No. 1 seed.

Baltimore

The Barons have the lead and only need to stay in front to lock up the No. 2 seed. Can earn No. 1 seed if they sweep and Dugway suffers a complete meltdown.

Dutch Harbor

This is the best division race. Four teams one game apart. Dawgs own tiebreakers over Tampa and Anchorage, but not Willow. Probably must win division to advance.

Arctic

The Gators earn a playoff spot and likely No. 1 seed with a win or losses by Dutch Harbor and Tampa Bay. Own a two-game lead with three to play over Lackawanna.

Bagdad

The Newts suck at the tie-breakers, so they need a better record than the Muldoon runnerup. Now, they have it. They also must hold off challenge from Alaska.

East Hartford

A win over Baltimore would give Ex-Mos a big edge for the division title, since they won the first matchup this year. They also have a tie-breaker edge over Limerick.

Tampa Bay

The Loogs have a chance. The have tie-breaker edges over Willow, Anchorage and Lackawanna. But, it will probably take at least two wins to make tournament.

Lackawanna

The Lancers can still win division and top seed. They need help. Arctic must lose at least once before their Week 14 showdown. Plus, they must make up points.

Alaska

The Oosiks can get the wildcard berth, will probably need to beat Bagdad to do it. Otherwise, they'll lose a key tie-breaker edge. Has tie-breaking edge vs. East Hartford.

Limerick

Loons can win division title, or earn wildcard berth. Wildcard is more likely, since division rivals above both won round 1 this year. Will probably have to win all 3 games.

Anchorage

The Kitchen lost to Lackawanna and Arctic, so only hope of advancing is by winning division. Only tie-breaker edge they have there is over Willow, so must win.

Flint

It's not going to happen for the Bison. In theory, they're still alive. But, it would take a scenario no one could dream up. In line for last seed in the Pee Wee tourney.

Denver

Pyles own edge over Limerick and Baltimore, so if they can finish second in Fireweed and tied with one of those two for wildcard, Denver returns to the playoffs.

Narcoossee

Kiss the baby goodnight. Nose Apes are out of it, unless there's a whole lot of ties. Must win a couple of games to avoid disgrace of not even qualifying for Pee Wee tourney.

Willow

The Weasels have tie-breaker edge over both Arctic and Lackawanna, so they only need to equal the second-place team there to earn wildcard, or win division.

Marley

The Wailers need one win in final three to avoid worse record in TFL history. They will probably need to win two to avoid embarrassment of not making Pee Wee tourney.

tion of anonymity, indicated that the organization is unhappy with Owens, who only this week scored more points than teammate Peerless Price, a sixth-round pick.

For his part, Owens bristled at the anonymous criticism. Not surprisingly, he's not exactly a fan of the Lancers, either.

"It's (freaking) cold up there, for one thing. Every time I whip the Sharpie out

of my sock to sign a ball, the (blasted) thing has froze up. Not cool," the 49ers receiver said. "And ain't Lackawanna where some of them terrorist dudes were arrested? (Screw) that, man. I don't want no *jihad* going down in the stands while I'm trying to score. Trade my (butt) somewhere warm and normal."

Even the league's grand old man, 40-year-old Jerry Rice of the Baltimore Barons, is squawking like a senior whose prescription co-pay has been increased.

"When I came to this organization, I was attracted by the two Sweeney Bowl trophies at team headquarters," the Oakland wide receiver said. "But after a day or two here, I honestly could not imagine how (owner and coach) Steve

Katz could have possibly won a game, much less two titles.

"It's funny, too, because Steve knows that I played on three Super Bowl teams with the 49ers, so he thinks we have something in common. He struts around like some TFL version of Bill Walsh, and it would be sad if it wasn't so pathetically funny.

"I told him one time that the difference between him and Walsh is that Bill won by out-coaching and out-drafting the other guys, whereas Steve seems to just wait for the planets to align for him. And that's a bad way to play football."

Asked what Katz's response was, Rice shrugged. "He said something. I couldn't understand it."
