12 teams in hunt for 6 spots with 3 to play

Only three weeks left before we know who wins the regular-season title; the points-scoring title and who is in the playoffs.

Here's where we stand: **Regular-season title**

The Flint Bison (9-2) can all but lock up best regular-season crown and 5 percent of the pot with a win this week over Denver. That would give them victories over their three closest pursuers, Denver (8-3), Alaska (8-3) and Lackawanna (8-3). Since the Lancers and Oosiks are playing each other this week, a Bison win would eliminate two teams (the losers). If Denver wins, then it's a free-for-all and Dutch Harbor enters the picture.

Points-scoring title

As karma catches up with Lackawanna, this race and 5 percent of the pot is now open, when it once looked like a rout.

Dutch Harbor passed the Lancers this week to take over first place with three weeks to play. The standings:

to clinch a playoff berth. Denver and Lackawanna could have clinched this past weekend, but both lost and Narcoossee won. Here are where the teams stand:

Lackawanna: Clinches with a win or Narcoossee loss.

Denver: Clinches with a win or Narcoossee loss.

Alaska: Clinches with a win or Narcoossee loss.

Dutch Harbor: Clinches with a win and a Narcoossee loss; or, two wins if the Apes don't lose.

Anchorage: Clinches with two wins and a Narcoossee loss; or three wins.

Narcoossee: Nose Apes need help. The Kitchen own the first tie-breaker (head-to-head), so the Apes must finish a game ahead. They must win two more games than Anchorage over the final three. And, if the Nose Apes lose a game, then that opens the door for a possible mess of teams at 7-7.

Arctic, Bagdad, Baltimore, Dugway, and Willow: These teams only chance is for both Anchorage and Narcoossee to finish at 7-7 (or worse)

and then get in on the tiebreaker. Too many variable to try and calculate that now.

Both Limerick and East Hartford have been officially eliminated from the playoffs and preparing for the Pee Wee Bowl.

Inside the numbers

When topic lacking, it's time to punt

Well, the staff here at Inside the Numbers just couldn't come up with a killer topic this week. So we're going with the potpourri approach. Here are some assorted statistical oddities that caught our eye over the past week.

■ **Zero Heroes** — We couldn't help but notice that in Week 11's games, three teams got zero points from their quarterbacks. Not coincidentally, all three teams lost. Or is it a coincidence? Does a QB zero always equal a loss?

Well, here at Inside the Numbers, we ask the questions, and then we answer them. But not before we fill up the TFL Stat Machine with high-performance jet fuel, turned the key, and let her rip.

The answer is — no. In fact, 95 teams in TFL history have won a game despite a 0-point showing from their QB. Most recently, Willow and Lackawanna turned the trick in Week 7 of this year.

But we can't recommend it as a strategy. Of the 359 TFL lineups in which a quarterback was held scoreless, only 36 percent mustered enough points for a victory.

■ **Calling Pete Rozelle** — Eleven weeks into the season, the TFL standings are showing all the balance of the Limbaugh Letter. Four teams have won eight games or more, and an astounding eight teams have won four games or fewer.

This got us thinking. Had any previous TFL season been more lacking in parity than the current one?

To determine this, we calculated the variance in winning percentage between the top three teams and

bottom three teams in every year since the TFL began in 1990.

And, believe it not, the answer is yes. In 1998, the year the East Hartford Ex-Eskimos dominated the league, the variance between the top three and bottom three teams was 49.7 percent — much higher than the 32.2 percent variance between the top and bottom teams this year.

But a record still may fall this season. With three games remaining, four TFL teams have a shot to win 10 games. And that would be a first — no TFL season has ever featured more than three 10-game winners. Once again, the year was



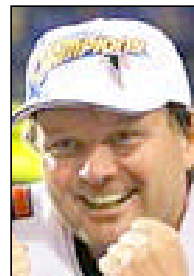

1998, when East Hartford won 12 games and Alaska and Bagdad won 10 apiece.

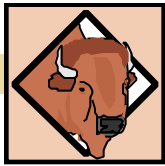
■ **Streaking** — In the offseason, the TFL Media Guide featured the top individual point-scoring streaks in TFL history. How are those streaks shaping up as Week 12 approaches?

The longest point-scoring streak at any position belongs to Jason Elam, who's at 102 games. Elam has yet to be held scoreless since entering the league in 1992. Trailing Elam is the ageless Morten Andersen, who's scored in 100 straight.

And how about the other ageless Anders(o)n — Gary, that is? He's far off the lead at 35, having been blanked during the 1996 season.

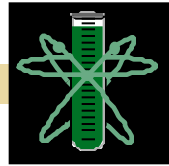

WILLOW, Alaska — Fantasy football is nothing more than society's back-door way for allowing gambling in our everyday lives. By running game-day lines and shelling out fantasy facts, newspapers, radio and TV are only promoting the idea even more. It didn't take long for the other sports to catch up.

Now we see extensive fantasy baseball stats as frequent as home run leaders. Just look at ESPN News, which runs entire on-screen boxscores. Hockey and basketball are closing in, too, though football and baseball seem to be the dominate favorites. But still football has to be No. 1, mostly because of its passion with games played once a week.

Playing the lines is like carrying the pigskin — you eventually get thrown for a loss.
